# Golden Gate Chapter President's Message, April 2007



## Its time to clean up our carbon

Every day in the news we read more about the global impacts of greenhouse gas emissions on global warming. The scientific community tells us with certainty that global warming, the changes in the global weather conditions, and the continued future effects will be devastating to all future generations:

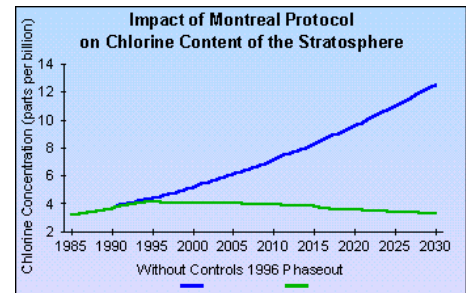
- The number of Category 4 and 5 hurricanes has almost doubled in the last 30 years.
- The flow of ice from glaciers in Greenland has more than doubled over the past decade.
- At least 279 species of plants and animals are already responding to global warming, moving closer to the poles.

If we continue down this path, expect catastrophic consequences:

- Deaths from global warming will double in just 25 years -- to 300,000 people a year.
- Global sea levels could rise by more than 20 feet with the loss of shelf ice in Greenland and Antarctica, devastating coastal areas worldwide.
- More than a million species worldwide could be driven to extinction by 2050.

We can't let this happen. We must take action, NOW! We can solve this.

In the 80's we learned about the negative environmental impact of refrigerants on the ozone layer. The international communities of the world rallied around this issue which led to refrigerant technician certification and world wide refrigerant protocols. The ES EPA website provides the graphical results of these interventions (right). Let's repeat this success with carbon gas emission reductions.



I recently attended a wonderful conference on creating “a clean, prosperous and secure energy future”, Energy Crossroads, at Stanford University, March 1-3, 2007. The conference was put together by students with vision and conviction to work out solutions to the global warming problem. The knowledge and clarity of purpose I gained from this conference changed my daily life's perspective on everything we do. I already considered myself one of the committed. I work towards better, more efficient buildings. I already recycle, turn off the lights and have contracted to put photovoltaics on my home. After this conference I realize it is time to do more.

As mechanical engineers, we are society's energy custodians. We need to meet this challenge head on. Let me offer a few educational resources to help further your personal education on the subject.

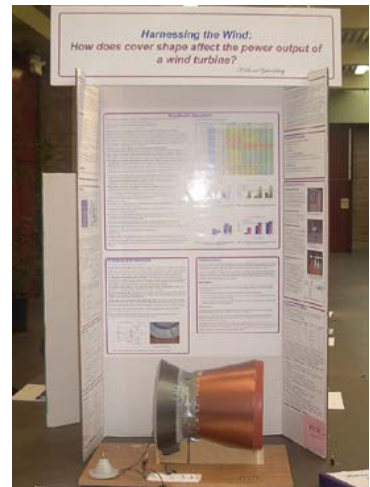
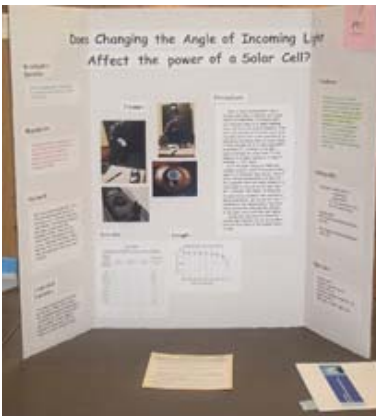
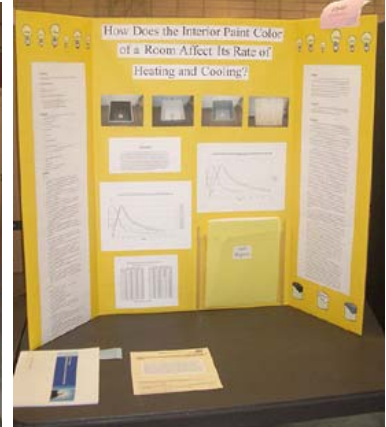

## Bay Area Science Fair Winners!

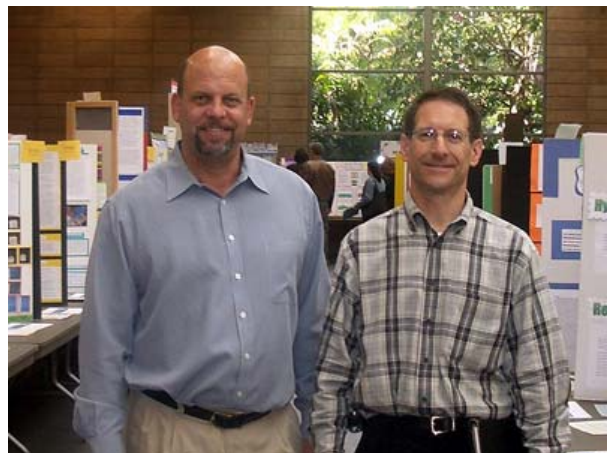

## UC Extension HVAC Courses

---

Temperature Controls for Heating and Air Conditioning Systems, a core course for the UC Berkeley Extension/Golden Gate Chapter co-sponsored HVAC/R certificate program will be offered this spring for ten weeks from March 21 through May 23, from 6:30-9:30 pm. This is a practical course that covers the design of control systems soup to nuts including topics on pneumatic, electric and DDC controls; sensors and control devices; development of point lists; energy efficient control sequences; open control protocols; issues for control retrofits; control system performance verification; and other topics. Several classes will be done in a workshop format. The course manual will be the ASHRAE Self-Directed Learning Course on HVAC Controls with supplemental notes by the instructors Steve Taylor and Mark Hydeman. ***This course is only offered once a year.***

X473 Temperature Controls for Heating and Air Conditioning Systems (EDP 313349) is one of the three core courses for the HVAC/R Certificate program co-sponsored by UC Berkeley Extension Service and the Golden Gate Chapter of ASHRAE. This course will be offered at the UC Berkeley Extension Service at 425 Market Street (at Fremont Street) in San Francisco. This classroom is conveniently located near the Embarcadero BART and MUNI stations. The course costs \$625.

### Spring Seminar

The chapter seminar committee and the CTTC are working on bringing a great group of speakers to the bay area on the topic of global warming. Check back in the upcoming months for more details.

### Government Activities

Assembly Bill 32: Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006 was signed into law September 27, 2006. It requires that the state reduce greenhouse gas emissions to 1990 levels by 2020— a 25% reduction! The California Air Resources Board (ARB) is responsible for monitoring and regulating greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions along the following timeline:

January 2007: Law becomes effective

June 30, 2007: ARB to publish list of early action GHG reduction

January 2008: ARB will adopt regulations on mandatory GHG reporting and verification

January 2009: ARB to provide plan for achieving statewide 2020 emissions limit

January 2010: ARB to implement early action measures.

January 2011: ARB to adopt emissions limits and reduction measures based on 2009 plan.

January 2012: Regulations become effective.

The Air Resources Board has formed committees to advise on implementation of the bill. The building industry is not currently represented on any of these, including the Technology and Economic Advancement Advisory Committee. Strong ASHRAE representation to subcommittees of the Technology and Economic Advancement Advisory Committee would be beneficial.
